Grace, Mercy and Peace be to you from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

Just a few weeks ago we had our annual voter assembly meeting, which I was unable to attend due to a stomach bug that kept me home that Sunday. I think it was the first Sunday I have missed due to illness in 20 years of ministry. It was a strange feeling to not be leading the Divine Service, but I am thankful that my Elders were able to step up to the plate and offer a simple service in my place.

If I had been able to attend the Voter's Assembly meeting, I would have talked about the past year and something of my vision for the future. When I say my vision what I actually mean is what God through the power of the Holy Spirit has done this year and will continue to do in and through me and all of you.

First and foremost, I want to thank God for the freedom that we have to worship God and receive His gifts in the Divine Service every week. Early on in 2020 it was decided to put air purification/filters in the church and to set up stations for hand sanitizers. These and other safety measures ensured that we had the safest possible environment to gather together. We have not had any breakouts of Covid or any other virus this year and we thank God for His protection. We have not lived in fear, but have steadily placed our trust in God and taken measured steps in our reaction to this virus.

We will continue to preach the Word of God in its truth and purity and administer the sacraments rightly in our congregation. I have always believed that nothing is more important that these two things for the life and vitality of a church. I promise to be faithful to the Word of God and the Confessions of our church and will continue to teach and preach accordingly.

We have been blessed this year with many new members. I have led 3 Catechism classes for adults and started a class for youth this year. It is exciting to think that in a year and a half we will have several youth be Confirmed in out church. It is also exciting that we have another adult Catechism class planned that will start in January. Along with the Catechism classes our Sunday morning class is now studying the Augsburg Confession, which is like our Magna Carta or Constitution.

We have also been able to add a communion rail and kneelers to our sanctuary. This has really set off the altar and also it gives us an opportunity to reflect on what is going on in the sacraments. Kneeling is not something that is often done in our society. It is a different body position and it fosters a sense of reverence for the Body and Blood of Christ that we receive in the Lord's Supper.

Moving forward I want us as a congregation to plan for opportunities to reach out to our neighbors and community at large. We are a very friendly and faithful congregation, but there is always room to improve. We will examine how we welcome our guests and try to ensure that we make them feel welcomed and help them with any questions they may have.

We are also going to look for opportunities to reach out. Before Covid we had started an initiative called

"Need a friend – be a friend". The goal was for us to provide an avenue for service and for requesting service. We have not been able to do much over the last year or so, but we hope to move forward with this idea. Ultimately this years focus can be summed up in this "Love God and Love your neighbor", these are the greatest commandments from God and we seek to accomplish His will for us and through us in joy and thanksgiving for His great gift of mercy and forgiveness that He purchased for us on the Cross. That is our vision, that is our hope and that is our joy. May God's grace be with you always to the very end of the age. Amen.

FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING December 14, 2021

The President called the meeting to order at 6 p.m.

PRESENT: President Glen Collier; VP Jim Jones; incoming Treasurer Barbara Wikel; Head Elder Mert Janovec; Head Trustee David Benson; Communication Chairman Kelly Freeman; and Pastor Poock. Barbara Gorman, DeWitt Gorman, and Nathan Kneser attended as guests. Absent: Treasurer Judy Faries; Financial Secretary Marilyn Howard; Recording Secretary Jean Roehrs;

Opening Devotion: Pastor read a lesson from Minute Messages based on Isaiah 40:3, "A voice cries in the wilderness: prepare the way of the Lord." Pastor discussed that the importance of Advent coming before Christmas is tied to the Law coming before the Gospel. We begin the Divine Service with confession and repentance which is also an expression of praise to God for our redemption; we understand our position before God and what He has done for us.

REPORTS

SECRETARY: Minutes for 11-15-21 previously approved via email. Jean Roehrs has submitted her resignation due to her health. Kelly Freeman agreed to record the Council meeting minutes in Jean's absence. For the Voters Assembly meeting, Barbara Wikel recorded and distributed the minutes to the Council by email. Mert Janovec provided minor comments on the minutes to Barbara. Kelly Freeman recorded the Voter registration and attendance for the meeting.

TREASURER: Reports previously distributed by email. No questions from the Council members. Barbara Wikel reported that she is working with Judy Faries and the bookkeeper to complete the transition of the regular duties for weekly and monthly payment processing. This week they will begin the process for the quarter and year-end closing. The bookkeeper has asked a question about the staff Christmas gifts. The Council has previously approved processing these as income to the individuals with appropriate amounts for the taxes paid by the church.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY: No report.

PASTOR: Pastor has recovered from his brief illness. Additional copies of *A Simple Explanation of Christmas* have been ordered. Members have been encouraged to share the booklet with others. Youth Catechism has 6 students attending. Another Adult Catechism Class will begin on January 5, meeting on Wednesdays at 6:15 pm. Thirteen people have already signed up. The current session of GriefShare concludes on January 3 and there will be a hiatus before beginning a new session. Two people have volunteered to teach Sunday School for children beginning in January. District is planning to resume in-person conferences in the spring. Pastor's reserve duty window does not resume until April. The hymn study for Advent has been well received and therefore also will be the theme for Lent services.

VICE PRESIDENT: No report.

PRESIDENT: Glen Collier asked the guests in attendance if they had any particular inputs. DeWitt Gorman said he is investigating the possibility of a fishing event for a fellowship activity.

BOARD REPORTS

COMMUNICATION: The Council Planning Calendar was reviewed for December – March. The Chancel Choir will perform on December 19 and Christmas Eve. The Bell Choir also will perform on Christmas Eve and will be deciding this week whether to also perform on Christmas Day. The Bell Choir is likely to continue after Christmas and perform periodically. Stephen Reay is not available from January – April, so the Chancel Choir will need an additional director if they wish to continue. After discussion, it was decided to continue the Friday evening movie in January with additional announcements to encourage attendance. Christmas decorations will be removed on January 8. February 6 was approved for the annual Volunteer Recognition Event. The current Time and Talent form was distributed, and Council members asked to provide input on changes via email.

ELDERS: Mert Janovec reported that since Ray Gilbert has joined the Elders, they will be updating assignment lists. Pastor Rabe has received a call to be the missionary recruiter. A new mission worker based in Uruguay, ______, has been selected for the Q1 collection. Pastor and the Elders are considering whether to offer 1 or 2 services on Wednesdays during Lent.

LWML: No report.

TRUSTEES: Dave Benson reported that AC maintenance was recently completed on the 6 units that cool other areas of the building besides the sanctuary. These units also are aging, and we should anticipate they will need significant repairs or replacement in the next year or so. The overflow parking area has been paved. Dave recommended installing wheel stops (\$60 each) due to the drop-off around the edges. Jim Jones made a motion to purchase them, seconded by Barbara Wikel and approved unanimously. Dave is also investigating lighting options for that parking area. For the lighting around and within the building, Dave is reviewing the operation and settings on the main control board. The kneelers are being installed this week. Dave obtained several bids to replace the sanctuary carpeting and proposed accepting a bid for \$1689. Jim Jones moved to authorize this expense, seconded by Mert Janovec and unanimously approved. After the new carpet is installed, it was requested that the process for lighting the altar candles be revised to avoid wax dripping on the new carpet.

NEW BUSINESS—

Additional communication was requested regarding the service on December 12 being led by the Elders.

Pastor will communicate at upcoming services the last-minute illness circumstances that led to it.

A preliminary discussion was held about potential options for additional support for Pastor's duties.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS_- none
