Recently, I have had several conversations around the topic of what is the Church. Article 7 of the Augsburg Confession states that "The church is the gathering of all believers, in which the gospel is purely preached and the holy sacraments are properly administered." When talking about the gathering of the first believers in the book of Acts Luke states "And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." Acts 2:42. This description is talking about reading scripture, the Lord's Supper, and the prayers as a set thing is understood to be the beginnings of our liturgy. The liturgy has its beginnings in the use of the Psalms as prayers during the festivals at the Temple. If you look at the beginnings of some of the Psalms you will see they are labeled as songs of ascent, as the priest mounted the Temple steps. There are other Psalms that were for other parts of the sacrifices. Then when the system of synagogues was established, because the Hebrews had been scattered across the world, the Rabbis would read set portions of Scripture to instruct the people. There was a reading from the Torah (the first 5 books of our Old Testament), from the Psalms or other wisdom literature and from the prophets. When Jesus read from the book of Isaiah and then told the people this had been written about Him, he did not randomly choose that portion of Scripture, but it was the assigned reading for that Sabbath.

So what does all of this mean for us. The church is a gathering of all believers, so does that mean church can happen anywhere? In some sense that is this is true, but there are requirements for it to be considered church. Matt 18:20 states "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them." So, is this church? No, it is not. In the context it is talking about prayer and the necessity of being in absolute agreement, but it is not church. Just because Christians gather together and pray it does not necessarily mean there is a church. The other side of it is the breaking of the bread and the teaching of the Apostles. In other words, to be Church means two things, the people of God are gathered together and a rightly called Pastor is there to preach the Gospel in its truth and purity and to administer the sacraments rightly. We work together to form the Church, you as the gathering of believers, and me as your properly called Pastor.

The Pastor is the servant of His Flock, but he needs a flock, or he is not a Pastor. The Flock needs a shepherd otherwise there is a tendency to forsake the teaching of the Apostles. We work together to create the Church.

Now in times of emergency the elders who are called by the Pastor to serve as his undershepherds are to be faithful men of God who assist the Pastor, as they have done this month when I was sick. The first time I got sick on Saturday and there was no time to find another Pastor to administer the sacrament of the Lord's Supper, so they read the lessons, prayers and a sermon that I had given them, but since they are not the properly called Pastor, they could not bless the elements of bread and wine, so you could not receive the Lord's Supper on that day. There was still an order to our activities, you still followed the liturgy and still heard the teaching of the apostles, but the breaking of the bread requires a Pastor.

And I thank you for faithfully coming to the Divine Service so that we can be the Church of God here on earth. May God bless you today and always. Amen.
