Ephesians 3:14-21

¹⁴ For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, ¹⁵ from whom every family^[c] in heaven and on earth is named, ¹⁶ that according to the riches of his glory he may grant you to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being, ¹⁷ so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith—that you, being rooted and grounded in love, ¹⁸ may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, ¹⁹ and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

²⁰ Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, ²¹ to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen.

We recently studied this text during my Wednesday afternoon Bible Study. I wanted to share it with all of you because it seemed to me that this section of scripture is extremely relevant now. Paul begins this section "For this reason", the reason that he stated earlier is that he has been made a minister of the Gospel for the sake of the Gentiles and has been imprisoned because of it. But he does not despair, because of the "unsearchable riches" and "the manifold wisdom of God" may be revealed to the church.

In these uncertain times, and they seem to be more uncertain every day, from the virus, to the domestic and international strife, to racial tensions and rising inflation, to the threat of war and a destabilization of the entire world it seems, is floundering with no hope and no one to turn to in time of need.

We as Christians however, know that there is hope and there is someone to turn to in time of

need. Paul says that God grants us through the power of the Spirit and the indwelling of Christ, that we are "rooted and grounded in love". This week we read the parable of the sower and the seeds. He planted the Word of God which took root in the good soil and produced a harvest. The Word of God and the power of the Holy Spirit are ours by His Grace, not only for everlasting life and the forgiveness of sins (though that would be enough), but also for the strength to face each day with joy and hope. When we see the news, and sometimes when we look at our own individual situation, we can be tempted to despair, but take heart, God through Jesus has overcome the world. He promised us peace that the world cannot give, joy in suffering, and a sure and certain hope.


Paul goes on to say that being rooted and grounded gives us the "strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth,

¹⁹ and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God." His love is great we cannot exceed it, we can never ask too much of him because he is abundantly able to do more that we could ever ask. Therefore let us rejoice in the LORD, for He loves us and gives us His peace. Amen.


CHURCH NAME TAGS

Mite Boxes

We want to thank those of you who so generously contribute to our LWML Mites. Based on the Biblical

account of the widow's mite (Luke 21:1-4), the Mite Box is intended for regular contributions of 'mites'

offerings above and beyond the support given to congregation and the LCMS. The idea is to put your coins in the mite box at the end of each day. Say "Thank you" with an appropriate amount whenever calamity or

misfortune has been averted. Empty all your loose change from your coin bowl into the box on a specific day of the month and bring your mite box to the church where you can leave it and take a new mite box or put it into the large Mite box. LWML ladies take the coins to the bank for counting. The bank counting machine DOES NOT accept half dollars nor any foreign coins. So please in your generous donations, be sure you are

giving semi-clean **U.S. coins**. The coins are converted to dollars which make it easier for our financial counters here at the church to deposit and then Faith LWML sends a check to the LWML FL-GA district to fund district and national mission grants.
