The sign of the cross may be made by all in remembrance of their Baptism.

HOLY GOSPEL

Luke 15:11-32

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the fifteenth chapter.

Cong.: Glory to You, O Lord.

¹¹ And he said, “*There was a man who had two sons.* ¹² *And the younger of them said to his father, ‘Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.’ And he divided his property between them.* ¹³ *Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living.* ¹⁴ *And when he had spent everything, a severe famine arose in that country, and he began to be in need.* ¹⁵ *So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs.* ¹⁶ *And he was longing to be fed with the pods that the pigs ate, and no one gave him anything.* ¹⁷ *“But when he came to himself, he said, ‘How many of my father’s hired servants have more than enough bread, but I perish here with hunger!’* ¹⁸ *I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, “Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you.* ¹⁹ *I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Treat me as one of your hired servants.”* ²⁰ *And he arose and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him.* ²¹ *And the son said to him, ‘Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.’* ²² *But the father said to his servants,¹ ‘Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet.* ²³ *And bring the fattened calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate.* ²⁴ *For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.’ And they began to celebrate.* ²⁵ *“Now his older son was in the field, and as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing.* ²⁶ *And he called one of the servants and asked what these things meant.* ²⁷ *And he said to him, ‘Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fattened calf, because he has*

received him back safe and sound.’²⁸ But he was angry and refused to go in. His father came out and entreated him,²⁹ but he answered his father, ‘Look, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command, yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might celebrate with my friends.³⁰ But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fattened calf for him!’³¹ And he said to him, ‘Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours.³² It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found.’” This is the Gospel of the Lord.
