Grace, mercy and peace to you from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen Recently I have been talking about the fact that we are not residents of this world, but really foreigners in a foreign land, Paradise is our home. In the book of Hebrews chapter 11, the writer talks about all of the Old Testament Patriarchs who lived by faith, having never seen the Messiah, but living in the hope of His coming. Because their hope was not of this world the writer of the book of Hebrews says :

All these people were still living by faith when they died. They did not receive the things promised; they only saw them and welcomed them from a distance, **admitting that they were foreigners and strangers on earth**. ¹⁴ People who say such things show that they are looking for a country of their own. ¹⁵ If they had been thinking of the country they had left, they would have had opportunity to return. ¹⁶ Instead, they were longing for a better country—a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them. Heb 11:13-16

In this month's Reporter (the official newspaper of the LCMS) there is a sermon from April 6, 1541 by Martin Luther. The opening paragraph of the sermon states:

Jesus says, "You've seen what kind of office I've carried out on earth, that I was sent by My Father, that I should begin a spiritual kingdom against the devil, sin and the power of death, so that those who believe in Me may have eternal life. I have done this not for any secular government. Indeed, I was even murdered by the world and cast out by it. But now through My resurrection I have entered into glory so that I may reign eternally over all creatures at the right hand of God the Father. Therefore, I now send YOU also, that you would be My ambassadors, not concerning secular matters, but to carry out and exercise the very same office I carried out, to preach the Word, which you have heard and received

from Me. This is an office by which people are saved from sin and death, people who feel sin and death and want help. His text is from John 20:21-23

²¹ Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, **I am sending you**." ²² And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive anyone's sins, their sins are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven."

Also in the Reporter is an announcement of the theme of this years Synodical convention "**We preach Christ Crucified**" which is from 1 Cor 1:18-25 where Paul contrasts the wisdom of God with the foolishness of man.

FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING FEBRUARY 14, 2023

Present: President Glen Collier, Financial Secretary John Niemi, Treasurer Barbara Wikel, Recording Secretary Jean Roehrs, Outreach Caleb Poock, Elders Mert Janovec, Pastor Poock.

VP vacant, Absent Trustee Dave Benson.

The President called the meeting to order at 6 p.m. A quorum was present. **Opening devotions** by Pastor focused on the truth that God's grace is for all; we are all equal in His sight. Prayers for members in need.

The minutes of January 10, 2023- were approved as printed.

Financial Secretary and Treasurer's reports were filed. The financial secretary requested that dedicated funds for Poinsettias and Easter Lilies be combined into one account labeled Holiday Fund. Approved by consensus. The treasurer reported that all funds from 5th Third Bank have been transferred to LCEF. The finance committee will be recommending how to invest these for maximum return. **Pastor's discretionary fund and expenses**: A debit card is needed for immediate requests; a credit card for other expenses, i.e. conferences. The treasurer will secure these.

Pastor reported that the bell choir will present at Easter as well as a vocal choir. There is another infant baptism scheduled in March. An adult confirmation class

began on February 16. A volunteer Sunday School teacher has been found. Pastor will be having sinus surgery on April 26. Pastor's Reserve duty runs from April through September. A vacation to Alaska is planned for late May or early June. Junior confirmation will be in September. Pastor has been invited to teach a two-week seminary class in South Sudan sometime over the summer. The council encouraged him to pursue the opportunity. The cost will be approximately \$3,500. The Revelation Bible study will continue during Lent except for Ash Wednesday. After-service meals will be served weeks 2-6.

Commutations/Outreach: Would like to explore the spiritual impact of Lutheran Theology. Will be compiling a list of outside resources-possibly on the website- for individual outreach. Interested in reaching out to youth and young adults. The President questioned if more secretarial help was needed to provide for communication needs. This will be explored.

The **Elders** are looking into starting a men's ministry; LLL was suggested. They are also looking for men qualified to serve as Elders. Criteria include attendance at Bible Classes and a mature faith. The Elders and Council will be hosting the March 1 Lenten dinner. GriefShare continues with 14-15 attending.

LWML is currently collecting for Redeeming Life, an LCMS maternity home in Sanford, FL. A representative will speak at the March 9 meeting followed by a luncheon. They are also sponsoring a collection of sweaters and jackets for infants to 5 years for Redlands Migrant Ministry. The congregation is encouraged to join in with the collections.

Trustee Report: Absent.


Directory: Plans are to have a password protected directory online for members to access. More information to follow.


Prayer Partners

Mite Boxes

We want to thank those of you who so generously contribute to our LWML Mites. Based on the Biblical account of the widow's mite (Luke 21:1-4), the Mite Box is intended for regular contributions of 'mites' offerings above and beyond the support given to congregation and the LCMS. The idea is to put your coins in the mite box at the end of each day. Say "Thank you" with an appropriate amount whenever calamity or misfortune has been averted. Empty all your loose change from your coin bowl into the box on a specific day of the month and bring your mite box to the church where you can leave it and take a new mite box or put it into the large Mite box. LWML ladies take the coins to the bank for counting. The bank counting machine DOES NOT accept half dollars nor any foreign coins. So please in your generous donations, be sure you are giving semi-clean **U.S. coins**. The coins are converted to dollars which make it easier for our financial counters here at the church to deposit and then Faith LWML sends a check to the LWML FL-GA district to fund district and national mission grants.
