From the Pastor



Grace Mercy and Peace be to you from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

A couple of weeks ago I had the privilege of attending the 68th Convention of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. These Conventions happen every three years and are the vehicle for making decisions, addressing controversies and electing leaders in our church.

I have copied the logo and theme of the Convention above. The theme “We preach Christ Crucified” could be heard and seen throughout the convention. Many of the resolutions that were brought to the floor focused on strengthening our Gospel message and encouraging the church to focus on the joy of being a Lutheran Christian, where the cross of Christ for the forgiveness of sins is emphasized and taught.

The Convention was not all just business. There was worship every morning and evening, starting out with a celebration of the Divine Service on Saturday night. It gave me goose bumps to hear a couple thousand people singing our hymns with gusto, especially since half of them were Pastors. We had different Pastors throughout the Convention talk about the six chief parts of the catechism. We had a young man named Flame, who is a Rap musician from inner city St. Louis, speak to the convention. He has recently earned a Masters’ degree in Theology from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. The joy he exudes when he talks about Baptism and the Lutheran understanding of salvation by grace alone was infectious.

There was also time for fellowship. I was able to reconnect to many of my classmates from college and seminary, including Rev. Dr. Mark Rabe, whom we supported for many years when he was a missionary in Ethiopia.

One of the greatest highlights for me was when the Evangelical Lutheran church of South Sudan/Sudan was welcomed into full altar and pulpit fellowship with the LCMS. There were other churches; The Lutheran churches of Finland, Uganda, Ukraine and Ceylon(Sri Lanka), but given the fact that I am going to South Sudan to teach at their seminary it was a

blessing to hear about their church and to talk with their Bishop. I was amazed to

discover that the Lutheran Church of South Sudan has 150,000 members. I am humbled to be a part of training men to be pastors in this country.

Probably the most disheartening part of the convention was when we voted to break fellowship with the Lutheran church of Japan. Having spent 6 years in Japan, Gwyn and I have a real love and respect for the Japanese people. It saddens me that they do not have a faithful church to witness to a culture that needs to hear the grace of God. Please join me in praying for them.

Much of the business was electing leaders for our Synod, and its various boards, as well as leaders for our universities. This was more important than it first sounds. One of our universities, Concordia Texas has been moving away from their Lutheran identity for years. It finally came to a head this year when they changed their by-laws to reject the LCMS involvement in decision making. A resolution to bring the issue to mediation was passed, which is the first step to correcting this error and terminating certain people who led the move away from the LCMS. After that there were several resolutions to ensure that this does not happen again, by strengthening the relationship between the universities and the LCMS doctrine and practice.

Several other resolutions focused on issues of the day, such as in person worship, racism, abortion and the use of fetal tissue in vaccinations, the sanctity of marriage, the affirmation that God made us male and female and others. These resolutions made it clear that our Church is dedicated to the teachings of Scripture as God has given them to us and we will not compromise our beliefs even in the face of persecution.

Finally there were several resolutions that focused on Doctrine and practice. One resolution encouraged all churches and pastors to practice closed communion as that has always been the doctrine of our church and the Biblical teaching. Another resolution encouraged churches and pastors to strive for even greater unity in doctrine and practice, it encourages open dialog and study of scripture to seek to correct those churches and pastors who have been willing to compromise on certain issues for the sake of expediency or ease.

We are not a perfect church, but we are striving to live up to the God given responsibility to preach Christ Crucified and to hold fast to the Biblical doctrines we have always taught. I was highly encouraged by the Convention. It renewed my faith in the future perseverance of our

Church as a Confessional Church that holds fast to the Scriptures as the inerrant Word of God and faithful to the Book of Concord because it is faithful to the scriptures. Peace be with you. Amen.

GRIEF SHARE 4.0 Program

This 13-week program features Biblical, Christ-centered teaching which focuses on grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. This DVD seminar features nationally respected grief experts, and real-life stories of people; followed by a small group discussion about what was just viewed.

Past participants have related how helpful the information in the DVD's, and follow-up discussions, were to them.

Many grieving people find that while they are beginning the task of healing, friends or family have already returned to their daily life routines. Too often people, including Christians, tend to suppress their grief. Instead, they need to allow themselves to learn to deal with their grief by attending this God-oriented program.

Please do not allow fear of what others may think, keep you from what could help you.

CONFIDENTIALITY is very much a part of this program.

Your bereavement experience may or may not be recent. You will find comfort, encouragement and help in grieving the loss of a spouse, child, parent, sibling, other family member or a friend. No matter what the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling.

You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in grief, and that you do not need to live in bondage to these uncertain emotions. You will learn valuable information about facing your 'new' normal in life, and renewing your hope for the future.
