Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

Over the last several months I have written about the Book of Concord and the different confessional documents that it contains. We started with the 3 ecumenical creeds and moved on to the central documents which are the Augsburg confession and its Apology. These documents form the core of our confessions.

Almost 50 years later, when the Lutheran church was under duress and in internal conflict the Formula of Concord was written to confirm what was indeed Lutheran theology and what was not. In doing so it confirmed that it was in agreement with the Augsburg Confession. The formula of Concord was the final document written in the Book of Concord, which was published a few years later. This Book of Concord gathered together in one place all the confessional documents that formed our theology. Included in this book were the Large and Small Catechisms, which were not written as confessions of the church, but where instructions for Pastors and Parents to teach the core of doctrine to their congregations and children respectively. Because they were so valuable and so highly regarded they were included as part of the Book of Concord.

There are two more documents that were included that we have not talked about yet. One, the Smalcald Articles, was written by Martin Luther, and is in fact the only real confessional document written by him. The other, the Treatise on the Power and Primacy of the Pope, which is a tract that was written by Philip Melanchthon as an addendum to the Smalcald articles.

After the Diet of Augsburg in 1530, where they were allowed to read their confession, the Lutherans asked for a free, evangelical and Christian council which would consider their teachings and also address the corruption within the church of Rome.

Six years later the Pope Paul III did convoke a council set to begin in May of 1537, but he said the purpose was the "utter extirpation, of the poisonous, pestilential Lutheran heresy." It was clear that this would not be a fair hearing. The Lutherans were startled and bewildered by the hateful tone, and were unclear what to do. Finally the Elector, John Fredrick of Saxony, asked Luther to write an ultimatum in response. The result is what we now know as the Smalcald Articles. This is often considered Luther's last will and testament as he felt he would be killed soon and he wanted a clear statement of his faith in his own hand.

The topics addressed are much the same as those of the Augsburg confession and the Formula of Concord. It starts with issues that both parties agreed upon, the Trinity and the deity of Christ as confessed in the Apostles' Creed.

Next he emphasizes Justification by faith alone, without works. Here he also rejects the concepts of the Mass as sacrifice, the invocation of the saints and purgatory. He also repudiates the office of the papacy. He makes it clear that the popes exercise of supremacy over the church and state demanding absolute submission in both is against scripture. He rejects the idea of the pope being able to declare new doctrines to be true even when it contradicts scripture, as such the papacy is the "antichrist", since it can declare anti Christian doctrines as true.

After this he then addresses Sin, the Law and the Gospel. The administration of the Gospel, particularly Baptism, the Lord's Supper and the office of the keys or Confession and Absolution. He states the Word and the sacraments are God's means of grace and he discusses the errors of Rome concerning these things. Finally he addresses excommunication, ordination, celibacy of the priests, the relationship between justification and sanctification, monastic vows and human tradition.

Melanchthon's treatise adds to Luther's stand against the Papacy. He rejects the "divine right" of superiority over all other pastors and bishops as well as the claim of his authority and power over the state. Finally he declares that excommunication should only be applied to impenitent sinners and must be handled with pray and humility and with much care.

The Smalcald Articles is the most "Luther-esqe" writing that we have in the Book of Concord. He is blunt and to the point. For various reasons the Articles were not immediately accepted, but soon after they were written his friend, Rev Bugenhagen, persuaded 44 leading theologians to sign it. In 1580 when the Book of Concord was first published it was recognized as an official Lutheran confession.

We have now completed a brief overview of the foundational documents of the Lutheran Confession of faith. I pray that this might encourage you to dig deeper into your faith and allow these teachings to be a firm foundation of the gift of faith that has been given to us all in our Baptisms, by grace alone, by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

# FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH - CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING March 12, 2024

Present: President Glen Collier, VP Greg Wissner, Financial Secretary John Niemi, Treasurer Barbara Wikel, Recording Secretary Jean Roehrs, and Pastor Poock. Absent: Outreach Caleb Poock, Trustee Dave Benson, and Elder Tony Bowen. Guests Larry and Ann Colton.

Pastor shared a reading from *Minute Messages* discussing what we *really* need in life. He offered prayer for several members with immediate needs.

**Minutes** of 2-13-24 were approved.

Financial Secretary: report distributed.

**Treasurer:** The books have been closed for 2023. Barbara is wrapping up accounts in anticipation of changing banks.

**Pastor:** Pastor presented several possible recipients for this year's **outreach donations:** the church he attended in South Sudan which currently has no roof; a plan to supply 8 South Sudan native pastors with a team of oxen, each, to raise crops and support themselves. They currently work for no pay. Each project would require \$15-20,000. A third option is to supply financial assistance to a local author who has done extensive research on ancient Biblical history. He needs additional software to assist in his research with the goal of publishing his findings in the future. This is estimated at \$20-40,000. Pastor was asked to provide more information before a decision is made. These requests would be funded with undesignated bequests so that the congregation might share their blessings with others in need.

**Homeschool:** Pastor pointed out the growing popularity of homeschooling. He has been approached about opening the church to a Homeschool Coop where 25 children, 6-8th grade, could attend 3 days a week and learn practical skills as well as the usual classes. He would also be able to present some classes. The council expressed that they found this a great out-reach to the community and especially families with children. He will present more information at the next meeting.

**4 H:** Pastor also mentioned the possibility of sponsoring a 4 H club.

**Time Away:** Pastor will take off the week after Easter to rest up. He will be attending a LCMS Chaplain's Conference April 8-12. He has been offered an opportunity to fulfill his reserve duties by spending 2 weeks in June and 2 weeks in July at MacDill AFB. He would not have to be there Sundays. **CONTINUED**
