Merry Christmas and Blessed New Year. Around this time every year there are magazine articles and tv specials trying to explain why we celebrate the birth of Christ on December 25th. Most of these will follow the logic that was first mentioned in the 12th century by a Dionysius bar-Salibi, that the birth of Christ was moved from being celebrated on Jan 6th to December 23th to coincide with the pagan Sol Invictus holiday.

Given that this is first mentioned over 1000 years after Jesus actual birth, there is very little to recommend it. Especially since in the late 1800s biblical scholars (who did not believe that the bible was the inspired word of God, but rather man's ignorant ideas about God), used this idea in support of the new study of comparative religions, which tries to see how all religions have a common theme and they are all equally valid. Besides which, early Christians were very careful to distinguish themselves from any other religion and would never think of trying to connect themselves to false beliefs. They were willing to die for the truth and would not compromise on any issue of faith.

There is however are much more Biblical and reverent explanations for the date being Dec 25. The first is that there was an understanding among Rabbis, around 200 years before Jesus was born that great men were born in and around the Passover. One Rabbi, Eliezer says that almost everything of significance related to YHWH. He believed that the world was created in the month of Nisan, which would normally be March by our counting. He also believed that all of the Patriarch were born in that month, that Issac was born in that month, even on the date of the Passover which wouldn't happen for another 400 more years or so. And finally, to our point he believed that the Israelites' future redemption would come in the same time, the month of Nisan.

Later Christian authors wrote in a similar vein. Tertullian of Carthage in the 200s and Augustine in the 400s believed that Jesus suffered and died on the 25th of March, which would be the month of Nisan in the Jewish calendar. His death was more important than his Birth in the early church and for us as well. The day He died our debt was paid and we were given the gift of salvation to all who believe.

Since His death was only made possible first by His human life, the two events, conception and death have often been linked together. We can see this even in some later artwork.



Here we have detail from a painting by Mater Bertram's 14th century Annunciation scene. It shows the baby Jesus traveling from heaven to earth on the back of a cross. The idea being that the human body corresponds to the grave; the divine nature of Christ is buried in the body of mankind, so that He might truly die in our place as both God and man, being then buried, so that He might rise again, therefore bringing redemption to all people, not just the Israelites. So by this

reasoning Jesus was conceived on the same day that He died 33 years later. Since the date of the Passover in the year that Jesus died has been fairly consistently set as the 25th of March,

nine months later would be Dec 25th.

Another respectful attempt at trying to ascertain the Birthdate of Jesus comes from the Birth of John the Baptist. His father Zechariah, part of the division of Levites known as Abijah, was serving in the Temple, offering incense when he was greeted by the Angel (Lk 11-17). John was conceived soon after. We know that Mary was visited by the Angel Gabriel and told that her cousin Elizabeth was now 6 months pregnant (Lk 1:26-38). If we could determine the time of year that the division of Abijah was serving in the Temple, we could determine the time of John's conception, and birth and then determine Jesus'. From 1 Chronicles 24 we know the order of service of the divisions and Zechariah's was the 8th. There were 24 divisions and each division served for a full week twice a year.

Since they served twice a year and the Jewish calendar is lunar rather than solar, the dates would vary from year to year. Therefore, there is no way to be absolutely certain when Zechariah was in the Temple offering incense. There is one date however that works very well with our current date of Dec 25th and it makes sense Biblically. Luke 1:10 that the whole multitude of people were outside the Temple praying as Zechariah was inside praying. This leads us to believe that he was serving during one of the great festivals of the Jewish faith that required the whole nation to gather together. These festivals were Passover, Pentecost and the Feast of Tabernacles. The only feast that year that happened at the same time as Zechariah was service would have been the Feast of Tabernacles, which happened in late September and early October. This would then have John being born in late June early July. So that would but Jesus' conception in late March early April. This would then match with a December birthdate for Jesus.

All of this is speculation, admittedly it is speculation based on what Scripture actually says, but speculation none the less. As you know I am not a fan of speculation when it comes to the Word of God, so why have I spent so much time on this issue.

Two reasons; first- it is clear from the Bible and history that the birthday of Jesus was not determined by Christians to replace a pagan holiday. We can ignore all the magazine and tv shows that lean in this direction. We never want to cloud our faith with doubt about its origins. They have nothing to do with trying to replace one myth with another, but solely with proclaiming the Truth about God our Savior.

Second, I really wanted to show that the date of Jesus birth is not important. The fact that He was born is much more important, so that it might lead to his death. Good Friday and Easter are the central celebrations of the Christian faith. In them we find the hope of our salvation. But they could not happen if Jesus had not been born a man, so his birth is important as well, but only to confirm His ability to die. The early church was much more focused on His death and resurrection than they were about His birth. His death is connected to Passover, which is clearly the main event in the Old Testament as it is a forerunner to the Crucifixion.

Christmas is a wonderful time and we do not need to have any doubt about what we are celebrating. It really doesn't matter what day of what month Jesus was born since it was not clearly reported in the scriptures. But who we celebrate is important and that is why as one bumper sticker says "Jesus is the reason for the season". Keep Christ in Christ-mas, He came to this earth for you to save you and give you hope and peace. That is always worth celebrating. Joy to the World, the Lord has come.

FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH CHURCH COUNCIL DECEMBER 10, 2024

Present: President Glen Collier, VP Greg Wissner, Treasurer Barbara Wikel, Financial Secretary John Niemi; Recording Secretary Jean Roehrs, Altar Guild Eloise Schwarz, Elder Tony Bowen, and Pastor Poock. Absent: Trustee David Benson.

The President called the meeting to order at 6 p.m. A quorum was established. Pastor opened the meeting with a devotion from the Advent Devotion Booklet based on The Great I Am. He offered prayer for members in need.

The minutes of Nov.12, 2024 were approved as printed.

Financial Secretary and Treasurer's reports were filed. There has been a \$40,000 short fall with expenses up and donations down. Tony MOVED that expenses and income be published in the monthly newsletter. Motion seconded and carried with all voting yes. Further discussion called for more Evangelism, a plan for the future, and a method to establish counting the membership. John will work on creating an accurate membership record.

PASTOR: He reported visiting hospice and other home-bound members. Some have been "lost" following the hurricanes either changing location or moving to be with family. He teaches religion and civics to the homeschool children. There will be a wedding at the 10:30 service next Sunday. The church will match the Christmas donations to our service members. When asked about having VBS this summer, Pastor said that he had no objection if we have the necessary volunteers.

PRESIDENT: No report. VP: No report.

ELDERS: Deferred to later.

LWML: Will be packing Christmas gift bags for homebound members.

Trustee Report: Projects underway include interior painting and the removal and repair of mold in the roof/steeple area. A mold/mildew removal company will be contacted.

ALTAR GUILD: Distributed a yearly calendar for 2025. Eloise and Jean will meet with Margaret and incorporate this calendar with the one Jean had sent out.

FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING DECEMBER 8, 2024

Council Members Present: President Glen Collier, VP Greg Wissner, Treasurer Barbara Wikel, Financial Secretary John Niemi, Recording Secretary Jean Roehrs, Elder Tony Bowen, and Pastor Poock. Absent: Trustee David Benson due to a family emergency. There were 62 in attendance, establishing a quorum.

The President called the meeting to order at 12:30 p.m. Pastor offered prayer. **President' Report:** Glen stressed the valuable contributions of volunteers, listing the many opportunities available and encouraging the membership to join in. He also asked if we were inviting others to worship. We should reflect on God's word and pray for nonbelievers.

Pastor: Lots of good things have been happening. He pointed out the improvements made to the electric sign and the addition of the cross, made by Dave Benson. We've had baptisms, confirmations, weddings, and nine funerals. We have welcomed 25 new members seeking the pure word of God. He is teaching religion and civics to the homeschoolers. He has spent 19 years in the Reserves and will retire in another 4 years.

Minutes: Jean reported that the minutes of Dec. 2023 and June 2024 Membership meetings were reviewed by the Council and printed in the monthly newsletters. No additions or corrections were received.

Election: The candidate for office was Larry Colson for Financial Secretary. The president called the question: he was **elected unanimously**.

Financial Secretary and Treasurer's Reports: Income for 2023 and projected income for 2024 has declined. The budget reflects income equal to the past 2 years. Expenses are projected to increase due to the cost of utilities, insurance, and outsourced services. It also reflects a 5% salary increase. Jack Conte MOVED adopting the 2025 budget as presented. Motion seconded and carried by voice vote. A question was posed as to whether the congregation contributed all the funds sent to the quarterly charities. An additional \$5,000 is added to the amount contributed by the congregation.

Trustee: On Dave's behalf some of his many projects were highlighted, especially the addition of storage cabinets in the various meeting rooms, roof replacement, tree removal, landscaping, and sign improvement.

Elder: Head Elder Tony Bowen invited Mert Janovec to report on the Grief Share program. He reported that they have served over 100 people. Another session will be held after Easter. Facilitators are needed to assist with the sessions. Tony listed the quarterly charities for 2024. Bridging Freedom, the 4th quarter charity, offers housing, counseling, and assistance to girls rescued from human trafficking. They provide 30 beds; there are only 48 beds in the entire county. The 2025 mission recipients haven't been selected yet.

LWML: Marilyn Howard reported on the activities of Woman in Mission. The group meets the second Friday of the month, Sept. through May. Locally they support Hope Seeds, Project Heart with hygiene kits for homeless school children in Manatee Co., and Redlands Christian Migrant Association Preschool with school supplies and items for their kids closet. They also collect Mites for district and national mission grants and pack and deliver Christmas gift bags for the church's homebound members.

Communication/Outreach: Vacant. One duty of this position is maintaining the Facebook page and publicity.

Fellowship: Margaret Greenslade and Monica Carenza coordinate activities. They received a round of thanks.

NEW BUSINESS

Vicar: The Elders proposed that Faith participate in the Synod program for the 2025-26 school year. Students spend 2 years in the classroom, 1 year in vicarage, and then a year in the classroom, again. The cost varies depending on the vicar's age, marital status, and/or children. Pastor highlighted that the purpose is not necessarily to assist him or the church; rather to provide a training for the vicar dealing with all aspects of serving a congregation. He spoke of how valuable his vicarage was to him and that he would very much like to be involved with training future pastors. On behalf of the Board of Elders, Tony MOVED that Faith apply for a vicar for the 2025-2026 school year. A vote was taken by ballot. Tellers were John Niemi and Barbara Wikel. The vote was 43 yes, 6 no. Motion carried. The application will be sent to the district. If approved, it will be sent on to synod. There are usually more requests than there are vicars available for placement.

Pastor closed the meeting with prayer. Meeting adjourned at 2:05 p.m.
