Grace, mercy and peace be to you from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

Recently I have had several conversations about the role of elders in the church. Every Lutheran church has a group of elders, but it is often not clear what their purpose is, beyond helping the Pastor on Sunday morning with the Divine Service. You might be surprised that the Bible doesn't say a lot about what the elder is to do, but has very specific qualifications of what kind of a man an elder should be, especially concerning their faith, their behavior, their character and even the character of their wives and children. They are very similar to the qualifications of a Pastor.

Our understanding of the duties and qualifications of an elder come mainly from 1 Timothy 3 and Acts 6. All of 1 Timothy, 2 Timothy and Titus have insights about the Pastoral office as well, that can also be connected to the modern-day office of elder.

Now one of the first things we learn is that in each of these verses the title of "elder" is actually reserved for the position of Pastor. The person and office that we call pastor is called "elder" and "overseer" in the Bible. What today we call elder in 1 Timothy 3 is called "deacon". In Acts 6 they are not given a title, but they are chosen to "serve tables", so that the twelve (Apostles) could devote themselves to preaching the word of God.

Another thing we learn is that the "elder" or "overseer" is not necessarily someone who is physically older than everyone else, but rather is spiritually mature. If this were not the case, we would not send out 26-year-olds to be Pastors. So, the term elder refers to someone who has studied and continues to study the scriptures, someone who is mature in their faith. Timothy was a young man who was taught by Paul and established as an elder (Pastor), but Paul tells him "Let no one despise you for your youth, but set the believers and example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity." 1 Tim 4:12.

In Acts 6 the disciples(believers) were to choose men who were "of good repute, full of the Spirit and of wisdom." One of the men who was chosen was Stephen who is described as "a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit". He of course is the first Martyr for the faith, being stoned because he confessed Christ crucified.

We also read in 1 Timothy, "Deacons likewise must be dignified, not double-tongued, not addicted to much wine, not greedy for dishonest gain. They must hold the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. And let them also be tested first; then let them serve as deacons if they prove themselves blameless. Their wives likewise must be dignified, not slanderers, but sober-minded, faithful in all things. Let deacons each be the husband of one wife, managing their children and their own households well. For those who serve well as deacons gain a good standing for themselves and also great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus." 1 Tim 3:8-13.

Like the office of Pastor, elders, should be mature in faith, but also in conduct and in speech. In choosing elders one should look to those men who are actively involved in the Divine Service and Bible Study. In 1 Timothy 5:22 Paul tells Timothy "Do not be hasty in the laying on of hands". In other words, when calling a Pastor or choosing elders much time, prayer and discernment are involved in the process.

Today the Board of elders serve as a sounding board for the Pastor. They are able to give good counsel concerning the spiritual affairs of the church. They are to be peacemakers and not prone to provocative speech. They are also to help the Pastor in providing an orderly and respectful Divine Service as well as the caring ministry of our church. This does not necessarily mean that they must do all of the work, but they are to ensure that everything is done well. They are to help care for the spiritual well being of the congregation and especially help in caring for the widows who are without other assistance.

Please pray for our current and future elders as you pray for me that we might have men whom God raises up to help and be of service to our congregation's life in Christ. Peace be with you. Amen.

## FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH CHURCH COUNCIL FEBRUARY 11, 2025

Present: President Glen Collier, VP Greg Wissner, Treasurer Barbara Wikel, Financial Secretary Larry Colton, Recording Secretary Jean Roehrs, Trustee David Benson, Altar Guild Eloise Schwarz, Elder Tony Bowen and Pastor Poock.

The President called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m. A quorum was established. Pastor shared a devotion based on Colossians 7:3, Compassionate Heart. The minutes of January 14, 2025, were approved as printed.

Financial Secretary and Treasurer's reports were filed. Barbara reported that she is in the process of transferring funds from one bank to another. Larry is prepared to begin depositing offerings into the new bank as soon as the endorsement stamps are received. Barbara also reported that we earned over \$32,000 in interest from LCEF last year.

PASTOR: The organ is in need of repair. The former organ tuner has retired but Pastor has found someone who will be available soon. Adult confirmation will begin Feb. 16 with 15-20 participants expected. The vicar application is ready to be sent. Pastor is planning to attend "Higher Ground," a program for youth, next summer.

PRESIDENT: No report. VP: No report

ELDERS: Tony has clarified one paragraph in the Congregational Assistance Program guidelines which deals with the approval process. He MOVED adoption of this clarification. Motion seconded and carried with all voting yes. Jack Conte explained how the weight of the Corpus was an issue but has now been resolved. The sculpture will be personally delivered by the artist and he will assist with its installation. Due to the artist offering a discount, the remaining balance is only \$10,000.

LWML: They packed hygiene kits for Project Heart in Jan. and will pack Hope Seeds in Feb. All women are welcome to attend.

ALTAR GUILD: Eloise distributed an Annual Planning Calendar for 2025.


#### Easter Lillies

## **Mite Boxes**

We want to thank those of you who so generously contribute to our LWML Mites. Based on the Biblical account of the widow's mite (Luke 21:1-4), the Mite Box is intended for regular contributions of 'mites' offerings above and beyond the support given to congregation and the LCMS. The idea is to put your coins in the mite box at the end of each day. Say "Thank you" with an appropriate amount whenever calamity or misfortune has been averted. Empty all your loose change from your coin bowl into the box on a specific day of the month and bring your mite box to the church where you can leave it and take a new mite box or put it into the large Mite box. LWML ladies take the coins to the bank for counting. The bank counting machine DOES NOT accept half dollars nor any foreign coins. So please in your generous donations, be sure you are giving semi-clean **U.S. coins**. The coins are converted to dollars which make it easier for our financial counters here at the church to deposit and then Faith LWML sends a check to the LWML FL-GA district to fund district and national mission grants.
