Grace, Mercy and Peace be to you from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

He is Risen! He is Risen indeed, Alleluia!! What a blessing to be able to say those words, knowing that they are true and because they are true, we know that our God and Father accepted the sacrifice of His Son on the Cross as payment for the guilt of all of mankind's sins. The peace that comes from that certainty is why we gladly come to church to celebrate the Divine Service where He continues to give out His gift of life freely in so many ways.

In our Baptism we were washed in the blood of the Lamb. I am reminded of an obscure reference in the Old Testament prophetic book of Ezekiel 36:25-27 which states "I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes and be careful to obey my rules." Because we have been sprinkled with the waters of Baptism, we are clean, not of our physical filth, but of our spiritual filth, our sin. He has given us a new heart and His Holy Spirit is within us through those very same waters. We did nothing to deserve this, but it is a gift. What a marvelous blessing.

In the Absolution we are forgiven our sins by the Pastor as the ambassador of God to our church. Just this week we read in our Gospel lesson about the appearance of Jesus within the locked room where the disciples were hiding out of fear. When Jesus appears He gives them His peace and the Holy Spirit. He also gives them the responsibility and authority to forgive and retain sins. John 20:22-23 states "And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of anyone, they are forgiven; if you withhold forgiveness from anyone, it is withheld." In these words Jesus sets the stage for the Confession and Absolution that we still celebrate today. As your Shepherd I have the extreme privilege of offering you Forgiveness of your sins. He gave this to the disciples who then gave it to the Pastors that followed them who eventually gave it to all our Pastor today. What a blessing to hear the words spoken aloud, so that you may hear them as not a figment of your own thoughts and wishes, but as coming objectively to you from the voice of your Pastor who has been called by God through

Faith Lutheran's divine call to do this very thing. Be the voice of God to you. In Communion we eat and drink His body and blood for the forgiveness of sins and the strengthening of our faith. John 6: 54-58 states "Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him. As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever feeds on me, he also will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like the bread the fathers ate, and died. Whoever feeds on this bread will live forever." We feed on His body and His blood and in doing so we know that even though we die, yet shall we live, because He lives in us. After saying these words, Jesus asked His disciples if they would abandon Jesus because this was a very hard saying. They responded by saying "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life, and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God." Jn 6:68-69.

We sing those words in Divine Service setting One as we prepare to hear the Gospel. Here and in all the readings, the sermon and the rest of the liturgy we hear the Word of God spoken to us by God's Called and Ordained servant. Every Sunday we celebrate His death and resurrection and every Sunday, He gives us grace upon grace.

Let us always remember that our lives have been bought with a price and we are His. Let us thank and praise; serve and obey Him. He is Risen! He is Risen indeed! Alleluia!! Amen.


FOOD BARREL DONATIONS
