Grace, mercy and peace be to you from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

This last month I had the opportunity to serve my annual tour at MacDill Air Force Base. Every year I put on the uniform for two weeks and have the opportunity to the men and women of the United States Air Force.

You might think that since every chaplain is an ordained minister that the day-to-day activities of a Chaplain and a Pastor are similar, and there is some overlap, but my days look very different when I am wearing the uniform.

First of all the most common activity for most chaplains is counseling. Everyone in the Air Force, even those who are not Christians are encouraged to go see a chaplain when they are going through a hard time. I often have people come to my office and start out by saying "I'm not really religious...", but even when they say that they usually say yes when I ask if I can pray with them before we start. So from the very beginning I get to witness to the hope that is found in Jesus Christ to everyone.

People come to a chaplain because we have 100% confidentiality. This means that no matter what they tell me, I will never say anything to anyone, including their commanders. This means we are a safe place to process problems and try to brainstorm solutions. Now I think that many of their problems would get better if they have faith in Christ, and I can actually say that to them. Then I give them some practical ways to deal with their immediate issue. This allows me to plant a seed, sometimes they come back but many times I never see them again. But I have someone new that I am praying for.

Another opportunity that I have is to enter anyone's workplace and announce that I am their chaplain and I go around talking to everyone. They don't even blink, but welcome me into their space. This has lead to many great conversations about faith and life.


This year I have had several opportunities to talk about the specific Lutheran distinctives of the Christian faith. I was able to comfort one person by reminding them that in their Baptisms they became a child of God and He knows them by name and will not forsake them. This seems obvious from a Lutheran perspective, but they had never heard such comforting words before.

I also got to talk with a young man who grew up non-denominational, but was looking for a faith that was based on a more historical and biblical foundation. He had been studying Roman Catholicism, but had recently discovered the Lutheran Church-Missouri synod and thought that our beliefs sounded very biblical. So we had a long conversation about what we believe and how that is different from the rest of Christianity. Several questions about the nature of faith I was able to answer with very Lutheran terms, Justification, Faith alone, Scripture alone and Grace alone. After hearing the Lutheran/Biblical view he said it made sense and explained things that he had always had questions about. He is now going to look for an LCMS church to attend in Tampa.

I was also able to introduce the Athanasian creed to several people including a couple of Chaplains. When they read the creed, they looked up and said, this is good stuff, why have I never heard of it before. As Lutherans we have such a firm foundation of faith as is explained in the creeds, the small catechism and the Book of Concord. Serving as a Chaplain allows me to share our confidence of faith to a much wider audience than I normally am able to have as a Pastor. Thank you for supporting this ministry and please continue to pray for the men and women who serve in our Armed Forces. Peace be with you. Amen.




Adult Bible Classes

Honor Flight is a program that provides free trips to Washington, D.C. for veterans to visit the memorials dedicated to their service. The Honor Flight Network, a national non-profit, organizes these flights, prioritizing veterans of World War II, the Korean War, and those with terminal illnesses. Their Goal is to give veterans a chance to see the memorials built in their honor and to receive a hero's welcome. Their Mission is to

celebrate America's veterans by inviting them to share in a day of honor at our nations' memorials. And their Visions is: A nation where all of America's veterans experience the honor, gratitude and community of support they deserve.

On Tuesday, June 10th Gary Bonadurer was one of the invited Veteran guests to take the Honor Flight to Washington, D.C.





Gary shared a little of his experience with us and we are so proud and grateful for this information and his service.

Gary first found out about the Veterans Honor Flight a few years ago. This is a "cost free" excursion for all honorable discharged veterans who have served anywhere, at any time, in the Armed Forces of the United States. He served with the 14th Armored Calvary on the East German boarder during the late 60's. His brother served in Vietnam during the same time period. They both applied for the Honor Flight's 1 day mission to the Nations Capital in Washington D.C. After waiting almost a year, they were both selected for the same mission, seeing National War Memorials together on June 10, 2025.


Every Veteran is assigned a Volunteer Guardian to accompany them for the entire trip. The Guardian did everything for the Veteran including meals, walkers and wheelchairs if needed. It was first class. What a beautiful and Honorable experience it is for all Veterans, but especially for those of us who served during the Vietnam & the Cold War period. There were 74 of us selected for this mission on June 10th including: one WWII, five Korean War and Vietnam Veterans. Honor Flights for Veterans is a Nationwide Volunteer Nonprofit Organization with no government funding. They honor all our Veterans, and their sacrifice made, for our Nations defense. Gary encourages all veterans to apply and participate in this very special experience. There were about 1000 family, friends, Civic Groups, kids and Media waiting at the St. Pete airport for their return. The "Welcome Home" that he finally felt and the "Heartfelt Thanks" are beyond words.
